The Team



Some of these are also overseers over the 9 campuses we have throughout the nation.

The Solution

In stark contrast to traditional methods. we intentionally work against this mentality of dependency. Instead of bringing humanitarian aid, we build people from within. Jesus said in John 8:31-32 ""If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." The real truth, God's Word, will set people free in every area of their lives. Our focus is to teach people the Word of God for the people to see the truth. In addition,

we also teach leadership and entrepreneur skills to encourage people to grow their economy and improve their society. We deal with leadership errors that keep people in bondage and train leaders in skills necessary for success. We empower the locals to develop their own society just like the Western world was developed. By doing this, we have seen leaders all over the country see drastic changes in their lives, churches, and businesses.



Results

Many of our graduates have seem bigger. Many of our people done very well since finishing school. We have numerous testimonies of churches growing and the people in those churches starting businesses or getting good job offers. It is not just in the major cities where opportunities

in remote areas are getting the message and implementing it in their local communities. As a result, they prosper financially, their family units are stronger and they are an example for many in their local communities.

"I used to hold crusades and about 250 people would show up. After going to school and learning about leadership, team building, and delegation, I let my team do the entire planning for the crusades and I would just do the preaching. As a result, there are now 2500 people attending the crusades. This would not have been possible without the teaching I received."

2020 RESULTS

Back in March, 2020, we started our church coaching program. Pastor William Meni from Mombasa, Kenya has experienced a 85% increase in his church since he started - even during the lockdown! 35 of the families in his church lost their job, but after encouraging them to look for opportunities, they all found new jobs or started their own business during the lockdown. They have become such an example in the community that the church grew tremendously and he had 15 other pastors from the area who asked to be couched as well. This is the ripple effect of training just 1 leader.

In addition to pastoring his church, pastor Meni has also done farming projects this year. In the beginning of the year, he had a great harvest of green beans. Later in the year, he harvested 7 tons of onions. This is a direct result of the teaching and training he has received over the years. Pastor Meni is a man who has put to practice what we have taught him and as a result he is now reaping the benefits of it.


Online School, Coaching, and Conference

We also started a farming project on our Mombasa land. We are in the beginning phases, but have been able to secure water and irrigation which enables us to also farm outside of the rainy season. The farming will add some income to the ministry and also serve as and example and inspiration for the people we train all over the country.

In cooperation with Oral Roberts University, we are hosting a business symposium in Nairobi to train locals in leadership, business, and entrepreneurship


Conference
